CPI

The CPI Score relates to perceptions of the degree of corruption as seen by business people and country analysts, and ranges between 10 (highly clean) and 0 (highly corrupt). The results draw from polls of independent institutions. 158 (2005), 163 (2006) and 179 (2007) states were rated.

BPI

The TI Bribe Payers Surveys evaluate the supply side of corruption - the propensity of firms from industrialised countries to bribe abroad. In 2006, the results draw from the responses of business people to the World Economic Forum's Executive Opinion Survey. A score of 10 indicates a perception of no corruption, while zero means corruption is seen as rampant. In 2006, 30 state were rated.

¹ In 2002, Russia had a score of 3.2, ranking 21st of 21 countries.
