



- 6. Supervision, support and training for staff
- 7. Evaluation and review

Underphined by: Children Act 1989, UNCRC Articles 3, 12, 19, 24, 34, 39.

Seven Philopies: 1) The child's best interests must be the top priority. 2) Participation of children and young people. 3) Enduring relationships and support. 4) Comprehensive problem-profiling. 5) Effective information-sharing within and between agencies. 6) Supervision, support and training for staff. 7) Evaluation and review.


