Experiential and cooperative learning with alternative assessment methods

The general aim of the training activities of the Pestalozzi Programme is to train education professionals to become multipliers for Council of Europe standards and values in education.

The work is based on three main pillars

- <u>Content</u>: standards and principles as well as project results of the Council of Europe
- <u>Methodology</u>: learner-centred, peer-training, learning by doing, collaborative work on issues of common concerns to find fit solutions for diverse contexts
- <u>Four-fold concept of competences development</u>: developing sensitivity and awareness, knowledge and understanding, individual practice, societal practice

9. Target group (From Hungary):

Teachers and teacher trainers in any subject area can participate. Participants will be expected to try out and send a reflective account of their experiences with at least one activity or tool presented during the workshop within three weeks after the training event. Participants will also be offered the

possibility to continue sharing their experiences with experiential and cooperative learning as well as alternative assessment tools in an online space on the NING platform of the Pestalozzi Programme.

10. Focus of the training activity:

This one-day training event will consist of 5 sessions of 60 to 90 minutes exploring experiential and cooperative approaches to teaching and learning as well as alternative assessment methods. A team of two Hungarian Pestalozzi trainers will facilitate the training event with the assistance of an international Pestalozzi trainer delegated by the Pestalozzi Programme. The interactive sessions will offer practical training in the use of experiential teaching methods and cooperative learning structures aiming to develop participants' transversal competences. The attitudes, skills and knowledge developed during the training event will be accompanied by the presentation and practical use of alternative assessment tools.

11. Expected results:

- The participants will have a better understanding of the advantages and potential difficulties of experiential learning activities, cooperative learning structures, and alternative assessment methods.
- The participants will have gained practical training in planning and implementing inclusive and inspiring experiential and cooperative learning activities and using new and imaginative assessment methods to ensure that assessment is motivating, enjoyable and promotes the learning process.
