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Enlarged Partial Agreement on Sport (EPAS)

33 States; 850k€ Budget; Created in May 2007

-  Address the challenges facing modern Sport in Europe today, through policy and standard setting, monitoring, capacity building, and the exchange of best practices
-  An innovative, forward looking, pan-European Platform
-  For the first time, brings together all the stakeholders in sport, such as governments, international sports federations and NGOs
-  Open to non-Council of Europe member states, on a regular and formal basis



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Who?

33 countries are currently members:

Albania, Andorra, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Morocco, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Russian Federation, San Marino, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland and "The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia".
