“ONE WORLD, OUR WORLD”

The North-South Centre of the Council of Europe has the honour of inviting you to participate in the drawing competition “One World, Our World”.

Context

Under the slogan “One World-Our World”, the North-South Centre of the Council of Europe is celebrating its 20th Anniversary in 2010. The 20th Anniversary celebrations reflect the will of the Centre to highlight its history and accomplishments and honour the personalities that have either stood by it or reflected its values through the past twenty years.

The North-South Centre also intends to honour the youth and their vision of the values that guide its work: global interdependence and solidarity through education, youth, and intercultural dialogue.

Objective

The objective of this competition is to **promote the vision of youths on global interdependence and solidarity in the 21st century.**

The exact objectives are the following:

- Promote artistic production of youth;
- Promote reflection and understanding of youth on the challenges we face in this century;
- Take into consideration the contribution of youth in the real challenges that they face in their daily life;
- Highlight what unites youth around the whole world.

Who is the competition for?

The competition is aimed at youth between the ages of **6-12** and **13-18** and citizens of the world.

Works

The works should be submitted in the format of a drawing representing the values of interdependence and solidarity, with a short caption if necessary.

The drawings should be sent on either an A4 or A3 sized paper and should be one-sided. The caption should not exceed 2 lines and should be on the same side as the drawing.

Participants agree to relinquish all rights to their drawing. The North-South Centre will not return any drawing, selected or not.

Deadline for the submission of works

All the works should be sent to the national co-ordinators of the Global Education Week network¹ or directly to the North-South Centre² for countries with no representation in the GEW network, before **15 June 2010**. The authors should attach to the drawing the registration form found below.

Selection

On the basis of a pre-selection made by the national co-ordinators of the Global Education Week network, the North-South Centre will select 20 finalist drawings (10 in the 6-12 category and 10 in the 13- 18 category).

Exposition

The selected works will be made public on the website of the North-South Centre of the Council of Europe and exposed during the University on Youth and Development (Mollina, Spain, September 2010) which gathers over 300 participants from around the world.

Conditions

Submission of a drawing assumes that the participant has read, understood, and accepted the conditions mentioned in this document. No appeal on the method of the organisation or on the results of the competition will be accepted. Decisions are final. In the case of force majeure resulting in the modification or cancellation of the competition, the North-South Centre shall not be held responsible.
