Aim and objectives of Training Trainers for Human Rights Education

Aim of the course

The training course aims to develop the competences of trainers in non-formal education in their role as trainers or multipliers for human rights education with young people in international, national or local level, as a contribution of non-formal education to the promotion of the Council of Europe Charter on Education for Democratic Citizenship and Human Rights Education.

Objectives of the course

- To strengthen participants' understanding of key concepts and quality criteria of human rights education with young people including the role of activism;
- To review and address the essential competences (knowledge, skills and attitudes) for trainers working with human rights education in non-formal learning settings;
- To familiarise participants with the approaches and activities of the 'revised' Compass (the manual on human rights education with young people) and how to best use it and adapt it to different contexts and realities;
- To understand the role of human rights education in the broader movement for a culture of human rights;
- To develop the competences in advocacy for human rights education at local and national level based on the Council of Europe Charter on Education for Democratic Citizenship and Human Rights Education;
- To enable participants to develop activities and programmes for trainers and multipliers in human rights education;

- To contribute to the development of a pan-European network of trainers on human rights education with young people and to the mainstreaming of human rights education in youth work and non-formal education;
- To motivate and enable the participants to actively use information and communication technology as part of their own learning and in their human rights education activities;
- To associate the participants and their organisations with the priorities of the Youth Department of the Council of Europe related to human rights education.
