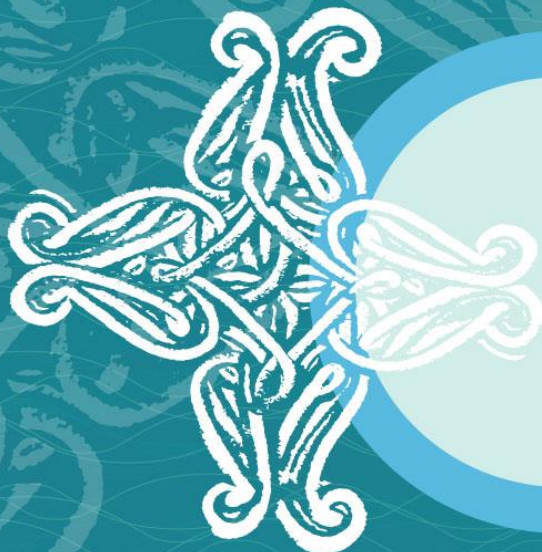

The future: Domestic policies for international cooperation

- **Ensuring the rule of law in cyberspace: Recognising and resolving the 1% problem**
- **Recognising and being prepared for the scale of the challenge in view of domestic criminal justice capacities and capacities for international cooperation**
- **Cybercrime and other crime violate rights: reconsidering/ recalibrating the rights versus security dilemma**
- **Develop policies/strategies on cybercrime and e-evidence**
- **Backed up by capacity building**



The future: Cooperation in practice

- **Domestic: interagency cooperation to address cybercrime and e-evidence as transversal matters**
- **Public/private cooperation: LEA/service provider cooperation, including transborder**
- **International cooperation: Enhance effectiveness of police2police cooperation and mutual assistance**
- **Backed up by capacity building and tools**



The future: International agreements

- **Multi-level bi-lateral, regional, international agreements**
- **Make best possible use of existing agreements (Budapest Convention, UNTOC, etc.)**
- **Roll out Budapest Convention to States ready to join**
- **2nd Additional Protocol to Budapest Convention probably most feasible international agreement in foreseeable future. Basis for:**
 - ▶ **more efficient mutual assistance**
 - ▶ **direct cooperation with service providers**
 - ▶ **extending searches**
- **Pacific Island States: Join international efforts on cybercrime and e-evidence ▶ Join the Budapest Convention**
