

## **ADELA CORTINA**

### **Currículum Vitae**

Adela Cortina is a Professor in Ethic and Philosophie at the University of Valencia since 1987. She has received a grant from the DAAD and the Humboldt-Stiftung at the Universities of Munich and Frankfurt, and was visiting professor at the University of Louvain-la-Neuve, the Institut for European Studies and the Mendoza College of the University of Notre Dame (USA ).

She is a member of the Royal Academy of Moral and Political Sciences, being the first woman admitted to the Academy since its founding in 1857. She is also a Corresponding Member of the Chilean Academy of Social Sciences, Political and Moral, director of the ÉTNOR Foundation, member of the National Commission on Assisted Human Reproduction and Advisory Board of the Ministry of Health, Expert Panel Member of the Program ACADEMIA by ANECA, board Member of the Human Development and Capability Association, of the Forum für Wirtschaftskultur Wirtschaftsethik und der Deutschen Gesellschaft für Philosophie and director of the Inter-University Master's and Doctoral Program, with distinction of quality, "Ethics and Democracy". She has conducted seven research projects as Principal Investigator and is member of the Scientific Committee of national and international journals.

She has a Ph.D. "honoris causa" of the Universidad Jaime I of Castellón, Catholic University of Valparaiso (Republic of Chile), University of Chile (Santiago de Chile), Universidad Iberoamericana de Puebla (Mexico), Universidad Iberoamericana Leon (Mexico), the Universidad Iberoamericana in Tijuana (Mexico) and Loyola University of the Pacific (Mexico). She received the title of Professor "ad honorem" of the University of Oriental Republic of Uruguay, the "Medal of National University" at the National University of Costa Rica, and the "Medal of the University of Murcia". Among others, she received awards including the Prize "Ernest Lluch the Pensament" 2003, the Prize "Isabel Ferrer" 2005 or the International Essay Prize Jovellanos 2007.

Among her books, the followings must be recalled : Communicative reason and solidaity responsibility (Sigueme, 1985), Minimum Ethics (Tecnos, 1986), Ethics without morality (Tecnos, 1990), Applied ethics and radical democracy (Tecnos, 1993), Citizens of the World (Alliance 1997), Alliance and Agreement (Trotta, 2001. Covenant and Contract. Politics, Ethics and Religion, Peeters, Leuven, 2003), For an ethic of consumption (Taurus, 2002), Ethics of cordial reason (Nobel, 2007) The boundaries of the individual (Taurus, Madrid, 2009) and Cordial Justice (Trotta, 2010).
