2. Summary

Audio report 5'25" - We chose to tell a significant story of inclusiveness inside a middle school classroom (Giovanni Pascoli school) in Matera. It appeared in fact to be an interesting instance of how a problem of a minority of people in a group might transform into a chance to improve learning processes in the entire group. Inviting all the students to adopt a software designed to help people affected by learning disabilities like dyslexia became a powerful way to avoid social exclusion for those who were already adopting this tool, and also a way to give to each of the students a chance to create his own path to learning different subjects, from foreign languages to maths to Italian.

3. Dissemination of the Output

At the time we're writing our output summary the audio report has been presented in a public square in Matera, although Radio3 – Italian public radio as well as Lithuanian public radio is supposed to broadcast it in the upcoming weeks. We have conceived our output for a general public, trying to be understandable even by those who have never heard about learning disabilities and compensatory software.
