Open Partial Agreement on the Prevention of, Protection against and Organisation of Relief in the event of Major Natural and Technological Disasters (OPA)

IIIrd Ministerial Meeting

Ankara, 9-10 July 1991

The IIIrd Conference of Ministers of the Council of Europe's Open Partial Agreement on the prevention of, protection against and organisation of relief in the event of major natural and technological disasters took place in Ankara, 9-10 July 1991. (1)

- The Ministers took note, with interest, of Turkish policy in the field of civil protection and European cooperation programmes being conducted in Turkey.
- The Ministers congratulated the various European Centres of the Open Partial Agreement on the exhibition held on the occasion of their meeting.
- 3. The Minister noted with great interest:
 - the creation in Belgium of a European Centre under the Open Partial Agreement to deal with the legislative aspects of disasters, which should be of great legal assistance to Member States and other European Centres under the Agreement;
 - the creation in Aveiro (P) of a European Centre on major industrial disasters, and the holding of an international conference on this subject in Lisbon in 1992.
- 4. On a proposal by the Greek Minister, the Ministers of the Open Partial Agreement asked that the problem of the control of nuclear installations be put on the agenda of their next Meeting.
- 5. The Ministers adopted resolutions on the following themes:
 - Follow-up to the Chernobyl nuclear accident Unanimously adopted (2)

(adopted by the Committee of Ministers on at theth meeting of the Ministers' Deputies)

The Committee of Ministers, under the terms of Article 16 of the Statute of the Council of Europe and with membership restricted to the representatives of the States of the Council of Europe which are members of the Co-operation Group for the prevention of, protection against, and organisation of relief in major natural and technological disasters,

Having regard to Resolution (87) 2 of 20 March 1987 setting up a Cooperation Group for the prevention of, protection against, and organisation of relief in major natural and technological disasters,

Having regard to articles 5, 11, 19 and 21 of the Financial Regulations

Having regard to Resolution (90) 44 of 5 December 1990, approving the budget of the Open Partial Agreement for 1991,

Having regard to the amendments to the budget of the Open Partial Agreement for 1991 submitted by the Secretary General (CM (91) ...),

Having regard to the report on the Open Partial Agreement by the Budget Committee, dated...... 1991, calling for amendment,

RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1

The appropriations granted for the 1991 Budget of the Open Partial Agreement are increased by 183.000 FF, as follows:

Article 2

The estimate of receipts under Article 1 - Sundry receipts - of the Open Partial Agreement's budget of receipts is increased by FF 183.000.

Article 3

Having regard to the initial appropriations and the amendments introduced by this Resolution, the budget of expenditure is increased from FF 8.198.000

to 8.381.000 FF and the budget of receipts from 8.198.000 to 8.391.000 FF

Article 4

The supplementary appropriations approved in this Resolution shall be financed by Belgium's contribution to the 1991 Budget, and therefore require no additional contributions from other Member States

Open Partial Agreement on the prevention of, protection against and organisation of relief in the event of major natural and technological disasters

It is proposed to increase the Open Partial Agreement's budget of expenditure in 1992 by a total sum of 1434.000 FF, over 1991.

It is intended to increase official journeys in 1992, taking into account the recent adhesion of two new Member States

It is proposed to increase the Consultants Budget, as more consultants will be attending meetings, following the accession of two new Member States

The budget increases requested for 1992 must be seen as adjustments, in real terms, to funds allocated in 1991. As in previous years, the participants in the Open Partial Agreement leave it to the Secretariat's Directorate of Administration to assess the financial adjustments being made or expected to be made in 1992 according to modications within the salary scale, and proceed with the actualisation of other funds.
